RE: Invitation to participate in a Civil Society Partners' Orientation for Habitat III Prep Com I

On behalf of the Habitat III Civil Society Working Group, we cordially invite you to a **Partners' Orientation on September 16, 2014 at the First Preparatory Committee for the Third United Nations Conference on Housing and Sustainable Urban Development** (Habitat III). For partners with long-standing work on urban issues and policy advocacy, as well as those just beginning to engage in these global processes, we hope this will be a meaningful opportunity to strengthen civil society engagement and collaboration towards Habitat III.

Habitat III (2016), which brings together governments, UN agencies, civil society, local authorities, and other relevant stakeholders to discuss the challenges and opportunities of urbanization and craft a New Urban Agenda, will begin in full force during Prep Com I on September 17 & 18 in New York.

The Habitat III Civil Society Working Group, composed of community based organizations, housing groups, planners and designers, architects and engineers, local authorities, academic institutions, and grassroots networks of urban stakeholders, has come together in this key moment in history to collaborate with one another and collectively advocate for the critical importance of a New Urban Agenda.

We welcome you to New York and invite you to participate in our Partners' Orientation, a multi-stakeholder dialogue that will reflect on Habitat II and the state of urbanization and cities worldwide, and review the roadmap to Habitat III and a New Urban Agenda. Following the panels, participants will engage in break out groups on key urban issues, such as planning, urban governance and rights, rural-urban synergies, living conditions and security of tenure in informal settlements, and urban policies for climate change and resilience.

An outcome document from this event will be submitted to the Habitat III Secretariat to document civil society's priorities, expectations, and recommendations in the Habitat III process.
